### NOTICE OF ANNUAL TOWN BUDGET MEETING TOWN OF ELLINGTON May 12, 2009

Electors and citizens qualified to vote in Town Meetings are hereby notified that the Annual Town Budget Meeting of the Town of Ellington will be held on Tuesday, May 12, 2009 at 8:00 p.m., prevailing time, at the Ellington High School, 37 Maple Street, for the following purposes:

1. To consider, and if deemed advisable, to adopt, pursuant to CGS Sec. 13a-99, a plan for repair of town roads and bridges for a period not exceeding five (5) years as recommended by the Board of Selectmen.
2. To accept, as recommended by the Boards of Education, Finance and Selectmen, prepaid grants and funds fully reimbursable for the Fiscal Year commencing on July 1, 2009 and ending on June 30, 2010, and to appropriate the same to the Board of Education in a sum not to exceed \$1,259,000 the allocation for which is on file in the Town Clerk's office.
3. To determine whether municipal tax shall be paid in two (2) installments for real estate and personal property tax in excess of six hundred (600) dollars and motor vehicle tax to be paid in one (1) installment with designated due dates as stated in the Connecticut State Statutes, Sections 12-142, 12-144, 12-144a and Public Act 77-343, Section 2 and to waive any property tax due in an amount less than five dollars as stated in the Connecticut State Statutes, Section 12-144c, as recommended by Tax Collector.
4. To adjourn the Annual Town Budget Meeting to a referendum to be set for Tuesday, May 19, 2009 from 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m., with one question:

*Shall the Town of Ellington appropriate, upon the recommendation of, and as allocated by the Board of Finance, the total sum for all expenditures, a/k/a budget grand total, for the Fiscal Year 2009-2010 the sum of \$44,153,184?*

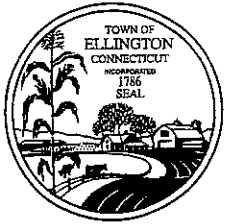

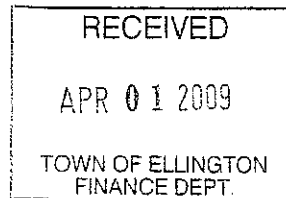

Dear Mr. Stupinski:

The Ellington Board of Education, at its regular meeting on March 25, 2009, unanimously approved the following motion:

"To recommend to the Annual Town Budget Meeting acceptance of prepaid grants and funds fully reimbursable for the fiscal year commencing on July 1, 2009 and ending June 30, 2010, and to appropriate the same to the Board of Education in a sum estimated at \$1,259,000 of which the individual grants are estimated to be as follows:

**Title I: Part A: Improving Basic Programs** \$100,000

Funds are targeted to improve achievement in reading and mathematics with grant entitlements based on family income indicators.


**Title II: Part A: Teacher and Principal Training and Recruiting** \$ 54,000

Supports increased student achievement by improving teacher and administrator quality and increasing the number of highly qualified teachers.

<b>Title II: Part D: Enhancing Education Through Technology</b>	\$ 500
Supports effective use of technology to improve student learning.	
<b>Title IV: Safe and Drug Free Schools and Communities Act</b>	\$ 3,400
Funds are targeted to support programs that prevent violence and foster a safe and drug-free learning environment.	
<b>IDEA: Part B: Section 611 Special Education Entitlement</b>	\$ 365,000
Individuals with Disabilities Education Act Designed to provide funds for the education of disabled children.	
<b>IDEA: Part B: Section 611- "ARRA Funds"</b>	\$ 439,000
Additional funds received for this two-year grant through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. These funds are recommended to expand learning time; increase capacity; provide professional development or technical assistance; or provide direct special education or related services to students and parents.	
<b>IDEA: Part B: Section 619 A Preschool Entitlement</b>	\$ 12,000
Designed to provide funds for the education of disabled children, ages three to five.	
<b>IDEA: Part B: Section 619 A Preschool Entitlement "ARRA Funds"</b>	\$ 16,100
Additional funds received for this two-year grant through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. These funds are recommended for early childhood programs and activities and to coordinate early intervention services.	
<b>Adult Education</b>	\$ 36,000
Matching state funds that help fulfill Ellington's legal obligations related to Adult Basic Education, the High School Adult Credit Diploma Program, the External Diploma Program, and GED Preparation Classes through the Vernon Regional Adult Ed. Program.	
<b>Perkins- Career &amp; Technology Grant</b>	\$ 20,000
Funds are used to purchase equipment and support for career and technology programs.	
<b>Open Choice Funds</b>	\$ 65,000
Funds are used to offset magnet school tuition payments required by Parent Choice legislation.	

<b>Summer Programs</b>	\$ 29,000
Fees paid by parents to allow their children to attend self-funded summer programs.	
<b>Preschool Tuition Funds</b>	\$ 44,000
Fees paid by parents of "typical peer students" attending the district's special education reverse mainstream preschool program.	
Other federal and state prepaid grants which might be applied for.	\$ 75,000
